Work and Industry (Sw)	"Empowerment" on the Waterside
Science and technology (It)	George Boole outside Lincoln Railway Station
Our World (It)	The Twinning Stone at The Lawn
Freedom (Gr)	"A mighty blow for freedom" – Temple Gardens
Migrants and refugees (Gr)	"The Face" at the Drill. (<i>Why is this included ?</i>)

Canwick: The Bomber Command Centre spire

Cleethorpes: Dudley the donkey

Donington: Matthew Flinders

Grimsby: The Fishermens' Memorial; Prince Albert

Scunthorpe: The Steelworkers' Memorial

Skegness: The Jolly Fisherman

Spilsby: Sir John Franklin

Upworth: John Wesley
